## **Rotary News**

### **ShelterBox in Burma ..... 3 months on**

After unimaginable loss of life, devastation and disruption caused by *Cyclone Nargis* in May, ShelterBox's last team in Burma has returned home.

ShelterBox is thought to have been the first aid agency to enter the country after *Nargis* struck. Five successive ShelterBox Response Teams (SRTs) – one of which included an Australian – were deployed to Burma to deliver vital humanitarian aid. Firefighter and SRT member **Ian Neal** was in the first team to enter the country, and was also in ShelterBox's last team, arriving in Cornwall last week.

Ian Neal was accompanied by GP and SRT member, Jane Nash said, 'on this last deployment, we were based in Labutta, where *three mile camp* is home to more than 5,000 survivors of the cyclone. Each day we travelled out to the remote villages of the Irrawaddy Delta to deliver much needed ShelterBoxes'.

*Cyclone Nargis* killed an estimated 130,000 people and caused widespread devastation. ShelterBox sent more than 2,000 boxes of aid to Burma, providing shelter for more than 25,000 people. The ShelterBoxes contained ten-person tents plus other essential items such as mosquito nets, cooking equipment, water purification and tools. Four ShelterBoxes were used as medical tents for the displaced. ShelterBox also worked ACTED to provide a number of fishing nets.
