When you enter the doors of the College you will notice a familiar sign “4 Way Test” which was presented by your Cub. I examined the contribution of Interact in the development of students at the College. And compared the “Test” to aspects of the College Mission Statement.

* Provide a comprehensive range of educational programs catering for the need of the individual and relevant to a changing society

* Challenge students to excel in all endeavours

* Promote awareness of & concern for significant world issues (e.g. Social justice, peace & ecology)

* Develop creativity, critical awareness and responsible decision.

* Nurture in all a sense of self-worth and self discipline, and appreciation of each person’s uniqueness, a concern for others and a sense of community and service.

The comparison between the Four Way Test and the Mission Statement involved looking at three of The Domains. In each of the Domains entries were limited to three areas.

Social Domain – 1. Confidence to Speak or Suggest 2. Leadership Skills Development 3. Interaction with Others

Cognitive Domain – Learning Procedures, Organisational Skills, Development of Planning

Affective Domain – Recognising of Others’ Needs, Service to Others, developing Responsibility and Trust

Of the range of social justice issues prevalent in the modern world some have been addressed by members who see justice and try to do something about. A pleasing aspect is that they do “good deeds” without the expectation of fanfares. For examples, monies sent to Nepal have helped who they will never know – their reward was that they had tangibly helped. On one occasion, the Nepalese coordinator forwarded photographs of the remote village that they had helped and a letter of thanks – the girls were delighted.
