GUEST SPEAKER: Chris Goninon

Chris was born in Brisbane and has lived there the majority of his life. He is married to Terri-Ann (who he met at RYLA) and has two children, Edward (6 years) and Annabelle (3 years). A business graduate from the University of Southern Queensland, he has worked in higher education for 18 years, and currently works as the school manager in the School of Human Movement Studies at the University of Queensland. In 2000 Chris was a team member of the District 9600 Group Study Exchange Team that exchanged with District 4590 Sao Paulo Brazil.



In December 2000 Chris joined the Rotary Club of Albany Creek and was president of the club in 2002-03, the year the club was recognised as the District 9600 club of the year. He served as Assistant Governor in 2005-06 and as GSE chair in 2005-07; he will be taking the GSE role again in December 2008. Chris was recognised by his club with a Special Contribution award in 2003 and Paul Harris Fellow in 2004. In 2008 Chris was the team leader of D9600 GSE team that exchanged with D9210 Southern Africa. The GSE team were involved in a variety of activities including occupational therapy, going down a copper mine 350 metres below the surface, lots of different types of farms, construction sites, Flying Doctor in Zambia, tobacco processing, radio stations, fish farms and gems. They engaged in a number of cultural activities with government officials and saw the best (private colleges) and worst (school on streets with blackboard and chalk) of education. Health issues included HIV, malaria, TB and infectious diseases such as chicken pox. Rotary projects in Southern Africa included looking after orphans, building wheelchairs and supporting people with disabilities, vocational training centres (Rotary club of Melbourne), freshwater, sustainable project for disabled, funding schools, and food provision. The team attended District 9210 conference and visits a large number of clubs. They travelled thousands of kms in a mini bus on very bad roads where travelling 700 kms could take up to 14 hrs.

Highlights for the team were:

- Micro light flying over the Victoria Falls
- Ebenezer Trust School and Orphanage (sponsored by Rotary Clubs of Maleny and Albany Creek)
- Mosquito net distribution sponsored by local communities and business.

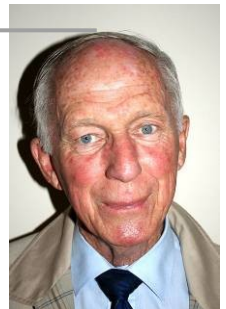
