LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER

SUBJECT: RAM—ROTARIANS AGAINST MALARIA

Malaria World Overview

Malaria is a poor man's disease. Endemic countries mostly in the equatorial regions around the globe although it does occur in cold countries as well

Life cycle of the malaria parasite (plasmodium) was explained and the "windows of opportunity" to break the plasmodium life cycle was discussed.

Internal residual spraying of houses and huts, getting people (particularly those with malaria, young children and pregnant women) to sleep under nets and the clinical diagnosis of malaria coupled with ACT treatment are the key to spectacularly reducing malaria infection rates.

Locals in endemic areas will develop an immunity to malaria after about 5 years exposure. Children under 5 have not had the time to do this and most malaria deaths are in the under-5 age group.

External funding to fight malaria worldwide has grown from US \$35m in year 2000 to \$1.7billion in 2009. There is no need to raise money for mosquito nets and insecticides etc, plenty of money is available.

Many groups working on a malaria vaccine, this may still be 10 years off

Some great successes with malaria infection reduction have occurred in many African and other countries. However some countries, particularly politically unstable or corrupt ones have very poor to negative results.

PNG has had no real success with combating malaria, however Solomon Islands are working hard and effectively, with significant Rotary help, reducing infection rates.

A TRF 3-H grant to reduce malaria infection rates in and around Honiara, the Solomon Island Capitol was discussed.



TIM RICHARDS ADDRESS (Cont)

Focus of this grant is on education at schools, women's groups, with radio spots and roadside billboards; mist spraying; internal residual spraying and bed net distribution. Also the Honiara Health Depts. malaria group liaise very closely with the 8 clinics spread around Honiara.

Conclusion that malaria infection rates can be dramatically reduced with the simple measures but it is more difficult to get infection rates right down to zero. Zero infection rate is necessary to ensure that there is no resurgence of malaria later.
