SOME LIGHT RELIEF

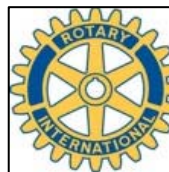
Many aspects of human sexuality are very puzzling, take celibacy. This can be a choice in life, or a condition imposed by environmental factors.

LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER

SUBJECT: Climate Change—The Facts

SPEAKER: Adj. Professor David Hood

- Unfortunately both the time and the space in this summary does not do justice to the importance of the topic and the collective facts provided
- David is a Civil and Environmental Engineer
- Chairman of the Australian Green Infrastructure Council
- He identified the changes that are occurring; Climate emerging to Global Warming, Finite Resources, Population explosion, Biodiversity loss and Greed
- By 2050 the world will have a population of 9 Billion
- Discussed a number of technical statistics and the amount of heat (direct and reflective) that the earth is absorbing.
- Identified the effects of rising CO² and temperatures
- There is concern about the Greenland ice cap disappearing, would result in a 7metre rise in sea levels around the world; This would result in Melbourne being flooded
- Indicated that whilst contacts were made in Copenhagen the "expected outcomes" were not achieved
