Interact:

Provision of advice and counselling in the establishment of Interact Clubs at local schools and colleges. The Club has been responsible for the formation of a club at Brigidine College, Indooroopilly

Rotaract:

This program is open to community minded young people between the ages of 18-30 years. Our Ambassadorial Scholar Patrick Day is seeking to establish a Club at UQ.

Rotary Junior Community Service Awards:

A program from primary school Children to establish an understanding of Community Service.. This year Awards were presented to Chapel Hill State School

National Youth Science Forum: (NYSF)

This program is intended to engender an interest in sciences for year 11 students by their attendance at an annual Forum held in a Capital City each January. RC Kenmore funded one participant in 2009/10.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards:(RYLA)

Provides youths between the ages of 18 and 26 years with lessons in life and leadership skills. RC of Kenmore funded one participant in 2009/10

Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment: (RYPEN)

Aims to provide students between the ages of 14 to 17 years with the opportunity to develop their leadership potential.

Youth Exchange Program: (YEP)

Provides students completing year 12 to travel overseas and benefit from both education and fellowship in a foreign country for a period of 12 months.

Rotary Australia New Zealand Student Exchange: (RANZSE)

Operates in a similar way to YEP except for students between 14 and 16 years and for a shorter period. RC of Kenmore is funding one student this year

Rotary Youth Driver Awareness: (RYDA)

A road safety education program targeted at year 11 students. The aim of the program is to reduce the death and injury amongst young people on Australian Roads . RC of Kenmore had involvement with the Kenmore State High School this year.
