## LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER

**SUBJECT:** Big Road - A journey to the Heart of the New Guinea Highlands—1953-56

**SPEAKER:** Bob Cleland

- Bob has turned author to produce a history of his time as a Patrol Officer in PNG
- The Highlands Highway, widely known as "The Big Road" now links the Highlands with the coastal city of Lae;
- Bob's father, Sir Donald Cleland was the Administrator of PNG for 15 years from 1952 to 1967;
- This book launch was the opportunity for Rotarians to acquire a historical account of the development of a country on Australia's doorstep. We hear about the role of the Patrol Officers but to hear first hand accounts was extremely enlightening;
- "The book evokes the work, experiences, environment, practices and policies as Bob saw them";
- Bob confirmed that when he started out his writing skills were not that great;
- He joined the Queensland Writers Centre to develop his expertise;
- He elicited the skills of a writing mentor who honed his obviously inherent skills;
- He found a "New" Publisher, Red Hill Publishers, who applied different techniques to bring the book to reality;
- He also called on his immediate family for technical and commercial assistance. The book is also a special thanks to Bob's wife Julie, who died before being able to "Edit" his work
- Bob has a plan whereby for all sales to Rotary he will donate \$5 to a fund to provide aid to indigenous people in the Highlands Province
- This was another example of what Rotarians can do when they apply themselves .
