SPEAKER: Vikki Graydon

- Continuing a 30 year relationship with the RC of Kenmore
- Latest development was a Multipurpose Building designed by Ray Giarola
- School requires some further assistance for new buildings and landscaping
- Instituted environmental studies and have commenced cleaning the general area and building a frog pond.
- The school has commenced a new project for the Richmond Birdwing Butterfly. This is an endangered species, already extinct from two thirds of its original habitat.
- Glenleighden School is the only school of its type in Australia, providing its unique services to children with learning disabilities.
- Looking to enhance their delivery of services to remote communities
- 72 full time students from prep to year 12. Its outreach program includes a further 300 students
- Teachers total 35 full time with additional assistance from part time and parents.
- Funds its operations from Govt. Grants, student fees and donations.
- The School does not have a Benefactor to provide funds for buildings and programs.
