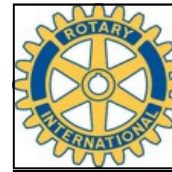

LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER

SPEAKER: Henry Zehr - "Murder and Deception"
 Was born in what was then Czechoslovakia (now Czech Republic) half way between the end of WW1 and beginning of WW2 - in a town called Olomouc. He matriculated at and qualified him as accountant. He was lucky to survive the German occupation - as he was half Jewish (mother) but his father was an Aryan. As the Nuremberg laws classified the father giving him the more important racial characteristics, he was spared, but sadly, his grandmother and uncle were not so fortunate. Mother was required to wear a star of David on her clothing. When the communists took over in 1948 his father managed to convince the authorities that they should let them go and they sailed into the beautiful harbour - Port Jackson (Sydney Harbour). No sooner that he stepped off the gang plank an Immigration officer asked him "How do you like Australia?"
 He found it impossible to get a job as an accountant as his qualifications where not recognised. He discovered that there was some skiing to be had at Kosciusko and it was for free if you worked on the Snowy Mountains Scheme, after that some fruit picking in the Goulbourn Valley and later on the assembly line at Holden in Melbourne. He had some previous experience of car assembly in Sydney at Ford. In those days when they asked him to do some welding they simply supplied him with a shield and a rod and told him to go and do it-no training.
 In Melbourne they discovered that he was pretty quick at counting nuts and bolts and promoted him to managing a tool store. There was very little work to be done so he decided to undertake a "Hemingway Robertson" accountancy course and managed to finish the first two years section in 8 months and sit for exams at St Kilda Town Hall. On transfer to Sydney he tried to get a job as an accounts clerk but his Australian occupations of working on assembly lines were not very helpful. A friend let him have a business letterhead of his on which he composed a different CV and got a job on the spot. He married an Aussie girl - sat for his final exam at Cloudlands (where, allegedly -in the gardens- half of Brisbane's population was conceived) and he had to go to the country to get a job in Public Accounting so moved to Tumut where his daughter Jana was born. Gained second qualification as Chartered Accountant. Back in Brisbane and started his brilliant career as Chartered Accountant. Joined the CMF for "adult boy scouting". Frightened CMF mates by inept handling of a Bren-gun-luckily all survived. Lost his first wife Joan after 35 years. Fortunate in finding Veronika being now married for 19 years. Bought a practice in Kenmore and operated it as sole trader for 25 years which he then sold just after GST was introduced in 2000.
 He would like to remind all native born about how lucky they are to live in "Australia Felix" and says that "us imports" know it anyway.
