HOW A SMALL CLUB HAS CONTRIBUTED TO POLIO ERADICATION

In the past nine months, the residents of Bribie Island, Queensland, Australia, have learned a lot about polio and the global effort to eradicate the disease. Led by the town's Rotarians, they've also given a lot back. In September, the Rotary Club of Bribie Island embarked on Project Eradication, aimed at raising A\$1 (about US\$0.80) for each one of the community's 19,490 residents. As the fundraisers unfolded, the project gained increasing visibility in the community and media. The club also sent out news releases about the work of Jenny Horton -- a nurse and member of the Rotary Club of Kenmore, Queensland -- in the polio immunization effort in India.

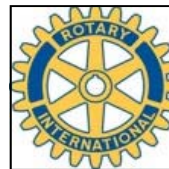
Renouf offered high praise for Horton, who also attended the celebration. Horton has worked for the Stop Transmission of Polio program in Botswana, Ethiopia, India, Nigeria, and Pakistan. The program was established in 1999 by the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and has received \$681,900 in grants from PolioPlus for volunteers' stipends.

SUBJECT: CRIME STOPPERS
SPEAKER: Detective Inspector Bob Hytch



- Bob is attached to the Brisbane West District for the Queensland Police Service
- Holds a BA in Justice Studies
- Crime Stoppers commence in Qld. In 1989
- Crime Stoppers is not part of the Queensland Police Service. It is managed and operated by community volunteers. Bob is the police representative on the Board of Management
- Crime Stoppers is Queensland's most effective tool in the fight against crime.
- The Police Service provides some staff to manage the process
- Crime Stoppers is not funded by Government but by community sponsors
- Since 1989—It has assisted in solving 19 murders and 18 attempted murders
 - Enabled police to seize drugs with a street value of \$5.7 million
 - Enabled police to recover property worth \$9.4million
 - Enabled police to confiscate \$2.6million in proceeds of crime
 - Resulted in 18,795 people being charged with offences
