## STOP PRESS

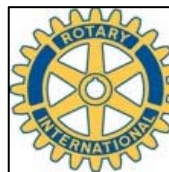

LAST WEEK'S MEETING—CLUB FORUM

The meeting entailed what were normal "spots":

President Joan : As the Club Forum most matters were being covered by Directors. However Joan extended a special welcome to Nancy Rogers and the two visiting Rotarians, Dai Reynolds and Mark Witenden.

Secretary—Ian Kilpatrick: No Report. Advised the distribution of the "Secretary Folder"

Treasurer: Kerri Horsbrugh : Kerri presented the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2010. The results were summarised as follows:

Club Service Director: Jack Rynn: Jack briefed members on the roles of each of his committee and the key strategies for the coming year



CLUB FORUM:

Vocation Service Director: Karen Cosh: As Karen was an apology President Joan confirmed that the key initiatives undertaken in 2009-10 would be continued in the coming year. The Pride of Workmanship Award would be the "centre-piece".

Community Service Director: Royce Allan: The club is rostered for DIK this weekend. All members able to attend would be appreciated, particularly new members. Royce encouraged any member partners who may have some time available to attend on a Thursday morning or on Saturday to assemble "birthing kits" Bill Orford was attending on Thursday to help sort hospital goods. The next Bunnings BBQ is set down for Saturday 7 August.

Youth Service Director : Colin Melvin: Proposes to continue with same projects as conducted in the past year. Confirmed that whilst the club uses the Youth Service designation, something it has done for a number of years, RI has at long last acknowledged the avenue of service as "New Generations" Colin took the opportunity to identify the wide number of projects the club embraces; RYDA, Junior Community Service Awards, Siemens Science experience, RANZSE Program, National Youth Science Forum, RYPEN and RYLA. Colin raised the issue of the Youth Exchange program and the need to obtain full club support in the event that it wishes to nominate an outgoing student and more importantly host an inbound student. It would be necessary to establish at least 5 host families. This could be established with support from other local clubs and also the Kenmore High School.

Intn'l Service Director: Brian Duddington: - As Brian is currently overseas President Joan confirmed that the Club would continue with the Ambassadorial Scholar and Peace Fellows Program support.

Home: Bob Rogers : Advised that Brian Stevens was suffering from a sciatic condition but was improving. Jim Foots birthday is on 12 July and a card is circulating.

WebMaster: Michael Price: Confirmed that the web site was now live. Addressed a range of concerns from members on content and access. While the main framework for the website is now fully operational there is still some work to be done with the Member section. This is a password protected section and is to be "styled" on a data base formulated from the club's historical "Blue Book"

Social Plans: President Joan confirmed the intent to hold a BBQ at her home on 1 August for members and their families. Ian Hutcheson indicated a Bare Foot Bowls afternoon in being looked at for early September.

Clothing Manager: Brian Becconsall: Brian advised members of the current stock of shirts and sought to establish any interest in long sleeve shirts.

Youth Greetings: Paul McLaughlin: Paul offered greetings from Anibal Dardossy (YEP 2000) and Leah Klass (Peace Fellow 2006/7)

Public Relations: Geoff Haigh: Geoff indicated continuing support from The Local Bulletin whilst there was some difficulty in having articles published in the South West News.

Suggested that we look at PR Training Seminars and also look to key events to obtain "traction" with the South West News. This could include the Rotary International Birthday in February 2011.
