LAST WEEK'S MEETING— JOYS OF LORD HOWE ISLAND

SPEAKER: Ian Cameron

- Compared Norfolk Island and Lord Howe Island
- Discovered in 1788 by HMS Supply
- Crescent shaped island 10km by 2km. Situated at 31 degrees South
- Part of NSW so travelers do not benefit from Duty Free
- Run by the Lord Howe Island Board
- 350 residents.
- There is one policeman reflective of the non existence of crime
- Speed limit for cars on island is 25km/hr and seat belts are not required. However walking and bicycling are the main source of moving around the island
- There are no real estate opportunities as land can only be transferred to island residents. One needs to have resided on the island for 8 years before qualifying as an Islander. All land is subject to leasehold.
- The school has 30 pupils and 2 teachers
- There is a 4 bed hospital, resident doctor and a medivac facility to handle medical emergencies
- There are no shopping opportunities so travelers will save money.
- The island is the home to mutton birds and wood hens
