VIKKI GRAYDON—Executive Principal Glenleighden School

- Along with our members, Brian Stevens, Bob Rogers, Bill Waterfield, Ray Giarola and Michael Fitzgerald, Vikki provided our members with a “potted history” of the school and the RC of Kenmore’s involvement.
- The Glenleighden School caters for children from preschool through to secondary school age and provides comprehensive, intensive multi-disciplinary programs which are highly individualised and address the full scope of the students development and learning needs.
- The club’s activities have involved Ray Giarola’s architectural expertise and members “grunt work” with painting, building, landscaping and numerous and varied projects. These activities were shared with Mount Coot-tha and Indooroopilly RC’s.
- The school currently has 72 students with a teacher ratio of 2-4 students per teacher.
- The school is unique as it is the only one of its type in the Southern Hemisphere
- The school uses IT technology to enable it to expand its Outreach Program.
- Members were given a conducted tour of the school with special focus on the latest development, a library and manual arts workshop.
