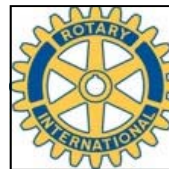

LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER:

Bob Cleland—Cruising the Kimberley

Boarded the Coral Princess in Darwin, a vessel of 35m, extremely comfortable with cabins, dining/lounge area and an observation deck. Darwin was named after Charles Darwin in 1839, settled in 1864, gold found nearby in 1871 and in WWII Darwin encountered 64 raids with 234 killed. In 1974 Cyclone Tracy a cat 5 hit killing 64 people
Day 1 & 2: The vessel sailed down the coast viewing the horizontal coloured strata formations of the coastline. Sailed into Tranquil Bay up the King George River to the King George Falls. Had an exciting rubber ducky ride into the falls. They viewed Gwion rock art at Hathaways Hideaway and Wandjina figures. On Day 4 Bob had a helicopter ride over Mitchell Falls which due to the rains was showing a triple formation and onto Careening Bay and saw crocodiles close to the boat. Day 5 was the Prince Regent River, King Cascades, red mangroves (unusual & deciduous) and Whirlpool Point. Day 6 was Sheep Island which was a cemetery of an 1865 failed settlement and a beer & BBQ on the beach.. Day 7 up early for croc spotting, some fishing and rain so off to Montgomery Is and reef. Day 8 was another early start with more rock art, note the male equipment depicted in the paintings and another wild rubber ducky trip into horizontal falls. The strata on the shorelines were now vertical close to Koolan Island iron ore mine. On day 10 saw the Lacepede Islands which had a long history of pearling and the largest nesting site of the Brown Booby (birds). That evening we had farewell drinks with the Captain anchored off Cable Beach Broome.
