IN MEMORY—SIR JAMES FOOTS

Sir James (Jim) was a member of the club from 26 March 1988. He was made an Honorary Member when he and Thora moved to the Sunshine Coast. Prior to joining the RC of Kenmore Jim was a member of the RC of Mt Isa from 1958 to 1973. During his term in Mt Isa he was the District Governor for District 255 (Changed to 9550). He was instrumental in the development of the Mount Isa Rodeo which today is a major event on the local calendar.

Jim was born in a small gold mining town of Jamieson, Southern Victoria in 1916. He had 12 siblings.

Won a scholarship to Melbourne University where he graduated with a degree in mining engineering in 1937

Initial postings included Broken Hill, Darwin (Wartime) and Captains Flat (NSW). Moved to his position as Assistant General Manager of MIM Ltd and over the next 30 years played a central role in the expansion of MIM Group's silver-lead and copper production

Appointed a Director in 1956, became MD in 1966 and Chairman in 1970
Retired from business in 1987
Held a position as Director of Westpac.
Chancellor of the University of Qld

TOPIC: THE MEMORY BOOK

- Gained her PHD in Computer Science at UQ
- Focussed on Computational Brain Summations
- Have you noticed that:
 - You cannot remember names
 - You do not always remember appointments
 - You do not remember where you put things
- All of the above are “normal” as we get older and the process can be improved through exercise and walking
- Loss of memory is related to worry and anxiety
- A strategy for improving memory is to be better organised and to write lists that can be referred to without having to remember everything
- The four pillars of memory are:
 - Physical exercise - Mental activity
 - Social support - Healthy Food
- Short term memory fails before long term memory because a protection mechanism is built up around long term memory
- Janet and her mother Judith have published a book titled “The Memory Book” Everyday habits for a healthy memory
