ShelterBox Response Team members are enroute to Japan following the devastating earthquake and subsequent tsunami that struck March 11. Rotarians Lasse Petersen (Brisbane), Mark Pearson (UK) and John Diksa (France) are mobilising while volunteers pack shelterboxes for immediate dispatch. The full extent of damage will take some time to become clear, however initial reports show extensive destruction spread across large areas of eastern Japan. Significant loss of life and widespread damage has occurred and emergency Shelter requirements will be a priority given night time temperatures at times below freezing.
